# DANCES MAKE A RETURN TO OSWEGO INDUSTRIES AND ARC OF OSWEGO COUNTY!


After a four-year hiatus, dances for program participants returned to Oswego Industries, Inc. and the Arc of Oswego County, creating unforgettable moments of fun and community.




